


HOPES


The future; an infinite expanse of opportunity. We are now at the stage in life when decisions concerning our future must be made. We must now choose the paths with which to reach our goals.



Ione Herrell was born on November 17, 1913. She died, after an extended illness, on March 20, 1973.


Mrs. Herrell taught in Augusta for fifteen years. She instilled in her students a positive attitude toward learning and toward life.


Mr. Gerald Way is the conductor of the Junior and Senior choirs. He also teaches music History and Theory to interested students.

Mrs. Larea Diehl is the instructor for Girls Physical Education. Individual and team activities are used to help the girls get their daily exercise.




BOYS PHYSICAL EDUCATION

BUSINESS EDUCATION



HOME ECONOMICS

Mrs. Juanita Rosenberg teaches classes which prepare students for managing a household. These classes include: Home Economics 8, Foods, Child Development, Consumer Education, Clothing and Textiles, Interior Design, and Family Relations.





INDUSTRIAL ARTS

Mr. David Rybak is the instructor for Industrial Arts. Junior High Industrial Arts, American Industry, and Pre-Building Trades give much background information as students prepare construction projects.



AGRICULTURE

The Agriculture classes are taught by Mr. David Gavin. These classes include: Animal Selection, Soils and Natural Resources, Farm Machinery, Agriculture 9, and Agriculture Economics. This instruction is important for students interested in farming.



DRIVERS EDUCATION

Mr. Norman Hoyme has the job of teaching Drivers Education. Classroom and Behind-the-Wheel training help prepare students for their positions on our nation's highways.



CAPSTONE COURSES

HEALTH OCCUPATIONS

The Health Occupations course, held at Altoona, provides a good background for students interested in the health field. Classroom instruction includes information on diseases, nutrition, and anatomy. Skills such as taking temperature, blood pressure, and giving first-aid are also taught.





FOOD SERVICES

The Food Services class is taught at Osseo. This course provides instruction in the preparation of food on a quantity basis. Sanitation, meal planning, food selection, and equipment care and selection are studied.



AUTO MECHANICS

The Auto Mechanics course, held in Augusta, includes working on the mechanical components of the auto - the engine, ignition, differential, and exhaust. Special attention is placed on tune-up and brakes.


SECRETARIAL PRACTICE

The Secretarial Practice course, also in Altoona, offers instruction in office skills. This includes typing, taking transcription, answering the business telephone, using calculators, writing business letters, and cutting stencils. Students also receive instruction in the art of "getting along with people."

BUILDING TRADES

The Building Trades course held at Osseo, is designed to provide technical information combined with work experience in light frame construction. Skill in the use of hand and portable power tools, the framing square, measuring, and other related layout tools is also stressed.

At 9:00 p.m. Dec. 29 at Chicago's O'Hare airport, a Pan Am 707 started down the runway carrying thirteen persons from Augusta, and over 200 other high school and college students to historical London, England. The plane landed at London's Heathrow airport at 10:00 a.m. Tour coaches took students and luggage to the "Leinster Towers Hotel" which would be their home for the next nine days.

Activities were planned for every minute of every day including visits to St. Paul's Cathedral, Buckingham Palace, Windsor Castle, Hampton Court, The White Cliffs of Dover, Canterbury, Westminster Abbey, Houses of Parliament, Big Ben, Tower of London, The River Thames, Hyde Park, Madame Trussaud's Wax Museum, Oxford University, Shakespeare's birthplace in Stratford-upon-Avon, the Cutty Sark, and three evening theatre performances.

Everyone learned how to use the underground, hail a cab, and understand some "typically English" dialogue in the days we were abroad. And some strong friendships and minor love affairs were started.

The group landed back in Chicago at 6:00 p.m. Jan. 6 loaded with happy memories, and extremely tired!

The tour was an Educational Tour sponsored by Viterbo College in LaCrosse.






BASKETBALL
