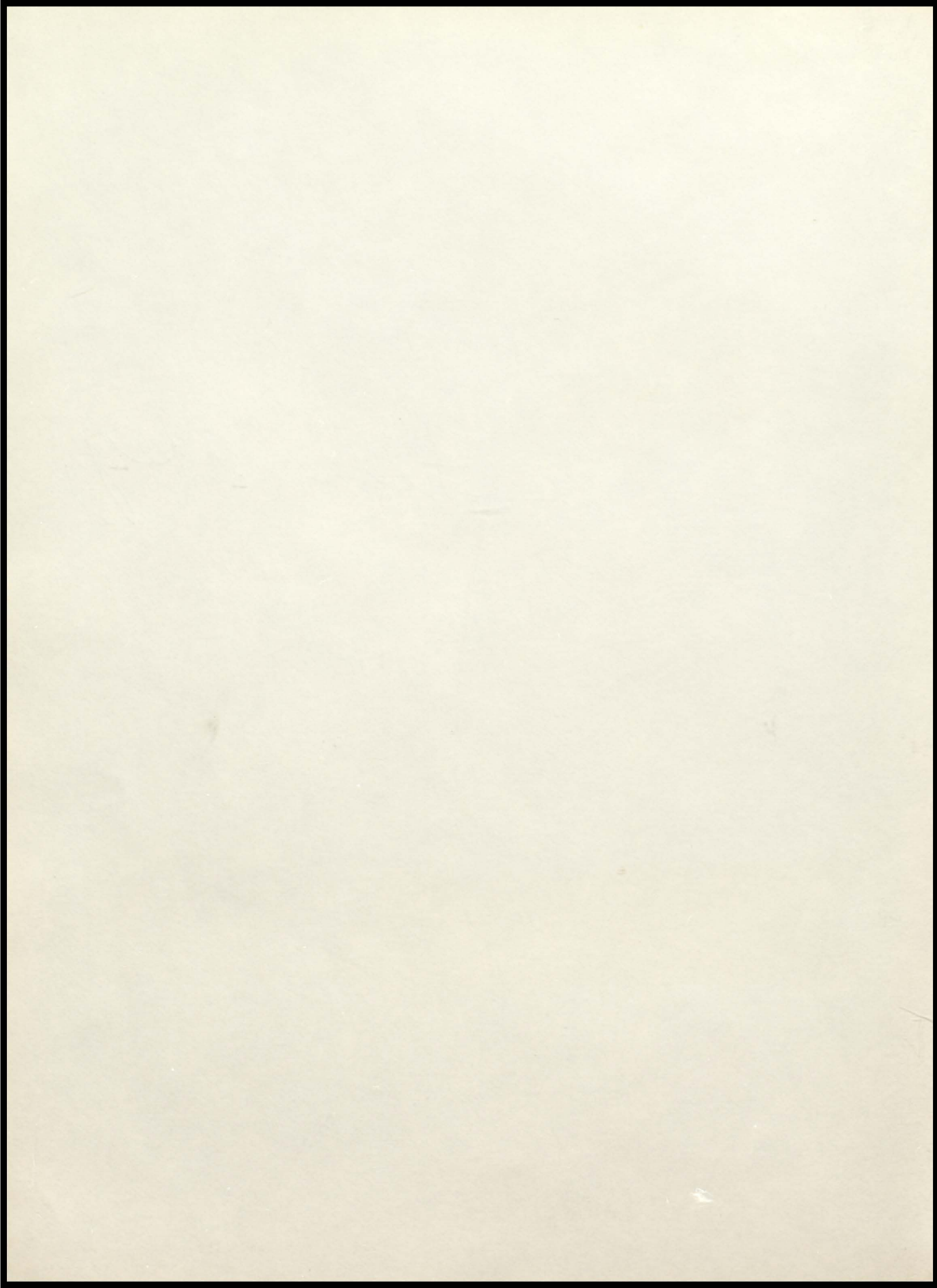




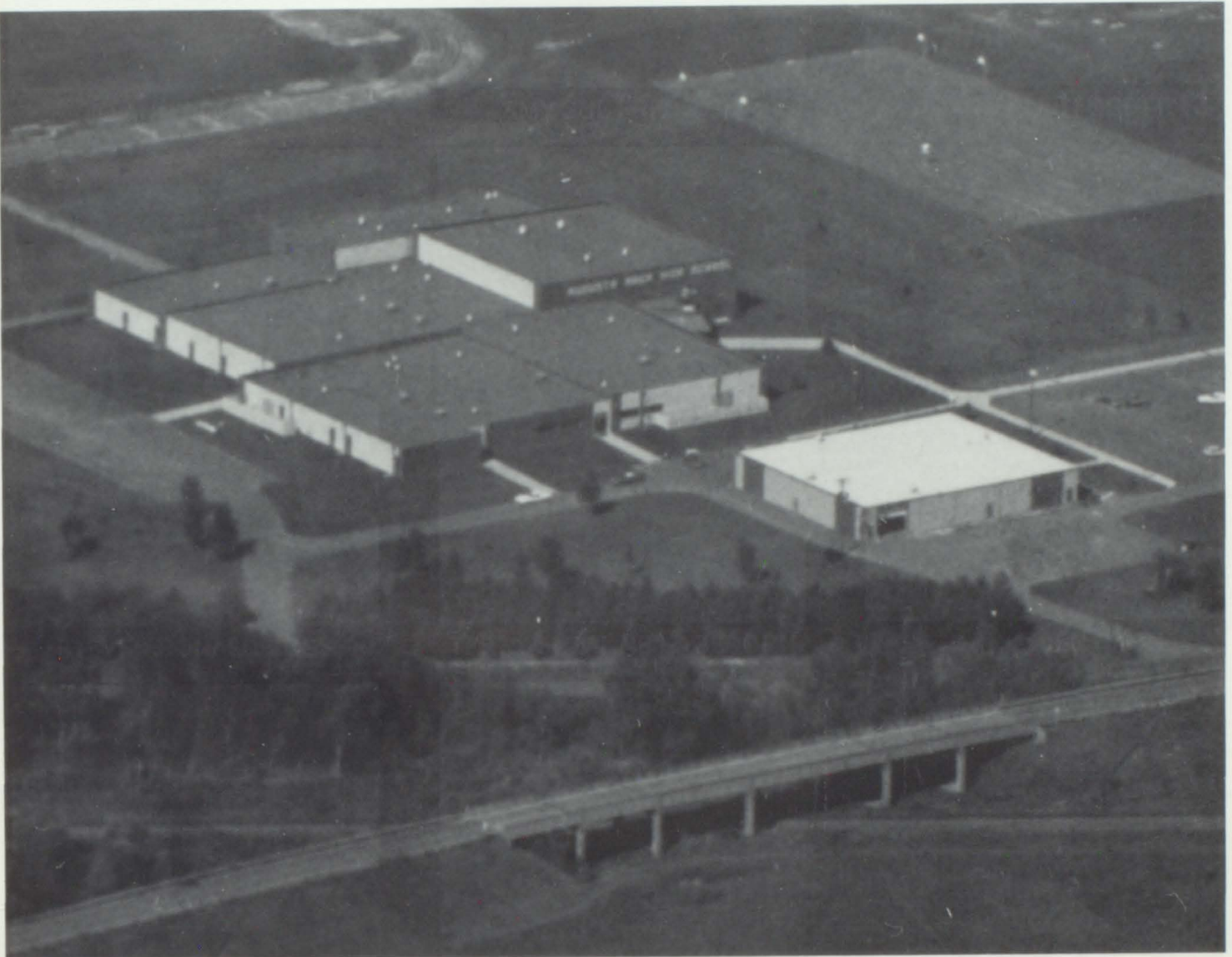



David Gavin

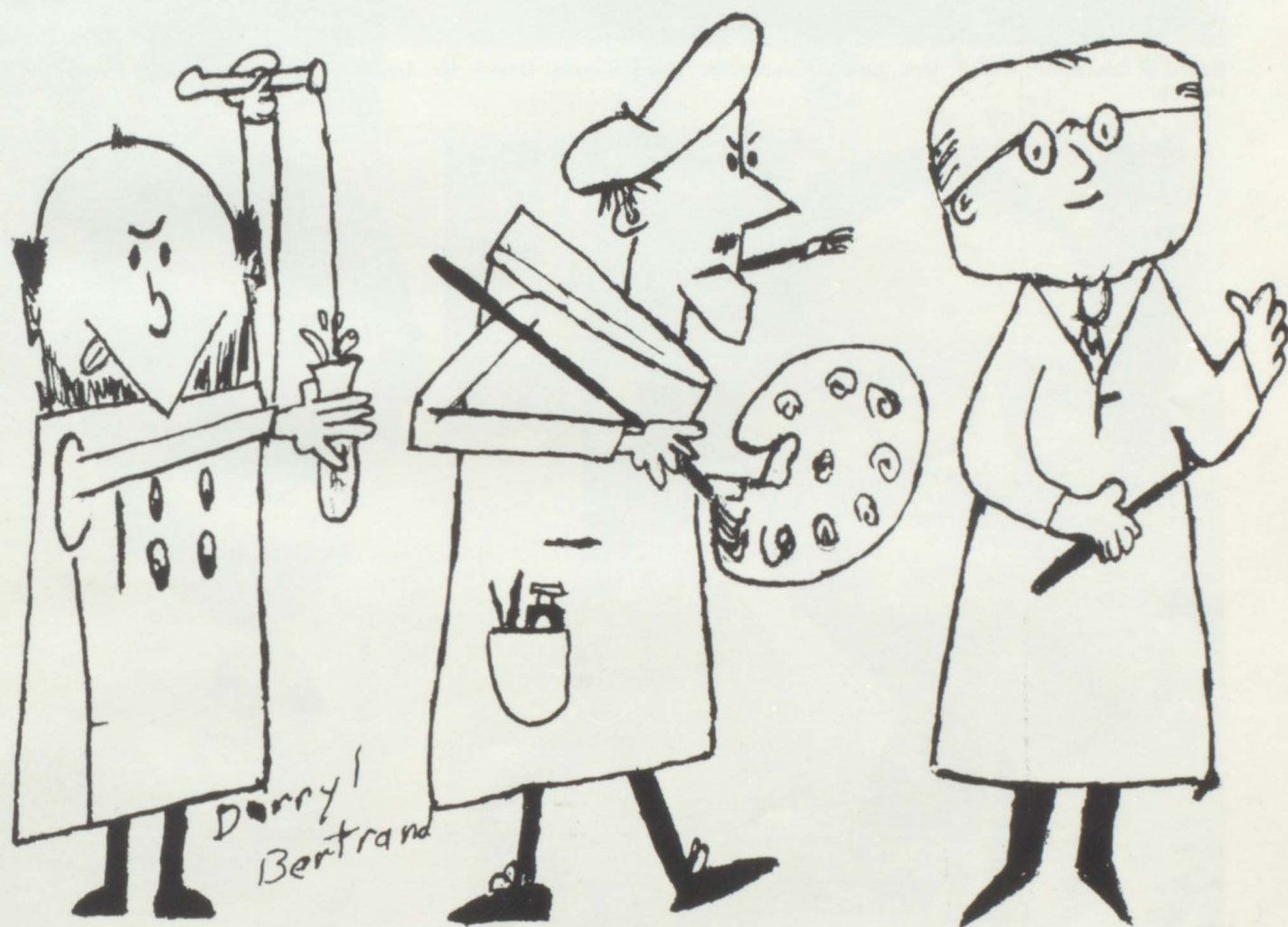
