STORMING SOPHMORES






FRESHMEN SPEAK OUT!




Electrifying Eighth Graders

Picture it, Greenwood, October, 1991. The Auausta Beavers and the Greenwood Indians prepared for a battle. This would be a battle between two powerhouse football teams. The Beavers, led by junior quarterback John Kelly and the Indians, led by senior quarterback Rico Rhondorf. The game started with the Indians receiving the ball near the 20 yard line. The Indians had to give the ball up when linebacker Jonathan Loaterman forced a fumble. The Beavers proceeded down the field to the 10 vard line. Coach Crowe sent in the screen pass. 




STRIKE A PROSE
